Journal- Have you ever moved before? If so, how did you feel about that major change in your life? If you haven't, do you think you would like to move to a new place where you didn't have friends yet? What would you miss?

From the Reading-

1. What details do we learn about Avery?

2. What do readers learn about the family in general? How do they spend their time together? How well do they get along?

Journal- Avery is meeting Owen and Landon for the first time, and his nervousness is similar to what some people feel on the first day of school. How do you usually feel on the first day of school?

From the Reading-

1. Describe Avery's relationship with his mom.

- 3. INFER- How does Avery feel about his dad?

Journal- Avery began surfing to have something to do with his new friends. He wanted to fit in better. What is something new you have tried to do recently? Or what is something new you would like to try to do? Describe the activity and why you chose to/want to do it. Is it easy to try new things? Fun?

From the Reading-

1. What "big" moments (two things in particular) happen for Avery in this chapter?

2. Officer Brown takes her morning to help Avery. Describe what we learn about her as a person from this scene.

3. The chapter ends with, "Avery doesn't remember anything after closing his eyes, that's how tired he is. And when he wakes up, everything is different." What literary device is being used here and how should it make the reader feel?

Journal- Avery and the town experience the shock and devastation of the loss of Officer Brown. Avery sees how upset people are, and he wonders if he is allowed to be upset because he did not know Officer Brown for very long. What do you think?

From the Reading-

1. "His stomach growls with aggression that will not be ignored." This sentence is an example of what literary device (metaphor, simile, alliteration, onomatopoeia, personification)?

2. "His mother is in the kitchen, mouth in a tight line, eyes staring in the distance. He's seen that look on his mother's face before, many times if he is being honest, when his dad is at work, on days when his task is a little more dangerous than others."

From this description, what can we infer about what has happened while Avery is sleeping? Why?

3. What do the boys decide to do to try to help the situation?

4. Why do you think Owen's dad is not happy to see the three boys at Officer Brown's house?

5. Why does Landon suggest the three boys investigate the murder on their own, separately from their fathers' investigation?

6. Avery is able to come up with a few potential reasons why this crime occurred. What can we **infer** about his father's career and experiences compared to the experience that Owen and Landon's fathers have had in their police career based on Avery's ideas?

Journal- Avery, Landon, and Owen go visit Mr. Bowen to get some information on town "gossip". What is gossip? Is it a good thing or a bad thing? In real life, can it be hurtful? Helpful? Should people gossip?

From the Reading-

1. What did Avery expect Mr. Bowen to be like? How is Mr. Bowen actually described?

2. What kind of police officer does Officer Brown seem to have been from Mr. Bowen's stories?

3. If you were a detective, would you trust Mr. Bowen? Elaborate on why or why not.

4. The chapter ends with Mr. Bowen telling the boys that serious crimes have been happening in their town. Does it make sense that Landon and Owen would not know anything about these things?

Journal- Avery really worries that he has offended his new friends in this chapter. Can you think of a time that you have hurt a friend's feelings? How did you feel? What did you do to fix it?

Or, if you have never hurt someone's feelings, what do you wish people would do when they hurt your feelings?

From the Reading-

1. When rumors start spreading about what happened to Officer Brown, Chief Fowler tells the boys that they need to wait and trust the _____. Why?

2. Owen's dad tells the boys that he is proud of them for wanting to help and for caring about Officer Brown's legacy the way they do. How do you think that made Avery feel?

3. When Avery approaches his dad later about wanting to help, what does his dad say in response?

4. Avery decides to do a little digging on his own, but he changes his plan to bring Owen and Landon with him to speak to the business owners. Why did he think he needed Owen and Landon with him? 5. Should the business owners give the three boys any information? Why or why not?

6. Of all the business owners, only one helps. Which one is it? Why do you think he says yes?

Journal- Avery knows that sneaking around the conference room in the police station is wrong, but he does it anyway. Why do people sometimes do things they know they should not do? If you were Avery, what would you have done? Why?
